1. Call to order and declaration of a quorum present.

Chairman Cox called the meeting to order and declared a quorum to be present at 6:40 p.m.

3. Discussion of agenda items.

Chairman Cox called for any discussion of agenda items. There was none.

4. Approval of the Consent Agenda:

a. Approval of minutes for January 7, 2019, January 22, 2019 February 4, 2019 and February 14, 2019 Meetings.

b. Approve payment of claims as presented in the Council Expense Report in the amount of \$649,422.16.

c. Approve payment of Golf claims as presented in the Council Expense Report in the amount of \$39,096.75.

7. Consideration and possible action concerning Resolution No. 19-P02 A RESOLUTION OF THE PURCELL PUBLIC WORKS AUTHORITY, PURCELL, OKLAHOMA, APPROVING AN INCREASE IN THE ELECTRIC KWH BASE RATE, AND RESCINDING RESOLUTION NO. 14-P04 AND 14-C06 AND RESCINDING ANY AND ALL OTHER RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT WITH THIS RESOLUTION.

Chairman Cox advised this is a proposal concerning adjusting mainly the fixed cost of electric meters. He advised it is his understanding that the fixed cost associated with each meter is close to \$50 per month. Our current rate is \$5.70 which covers 25KWH for residential users. Our commercial rate covers the first 200 hour. He proposed to adjust the base rate for residential to cover 200 KWH. He proposed to take the old rate of \$5.70 and add to 175 KWH added to \$0.0887, the math comes at \$21.22. As long as you use 200 KWH you should not see a change. He reported his research had indicated that only one occupied residential account actually used under 200 KWH in a month and it was in the 190's. All other accounts that were under 200 KWH were unoccupied structures such as shop building etc. Chairman Cox advised the purpose is to recover the base cost for little used meters. The other side of little used meters is that other customers are basically subsidizing for those meters.
